peppered with possibilities; a set of unknowns. The past is our only reference To which we can turn to find the tools to make choices. Yes? No? Maybe? I put it to you if a single individual is deemed guilty of the charge, we are all Guilty. To 'fear-monger', the future', is to approach it with care and caution

To "over-respect" the past is surely a journey to determine the best and the worst Of our experience. We are presented with an equation, I suggest: on one side The past, which in some way = the future; that we cannot escape. Can we? Let us examine the terms, "fear-mongering" has a negative tone to it, a criticism

Is it the case of purposely and purposefully seeking the negative elements and Focussing on them, to the detriment of the optimistic? In such a case, the charge becomes less an insult, and more a gentle comment; an acknowledgement of human frailty Equally, the over respect" for the past. The future and the past exist on a continuum

Between extremes. Our job is to find our way within those extremes. So, yes We can "over respect" the past; give events that have been and gone, an undue Regard; a measure of self-confidence, or the lack of? Paints a different picture Doesn't it? Our actor on the stage is not differently dressed for the part

Instead of battle attire, they wear something less threatening When confronted with, "YOU are fear-mongering the future, and over-respecting the past!", they can reply, "Possibly, yes That could be true. Thank you for your observation.
